In the name of God Amen the ninth day of July
1760. I Nathl. Moore of the County of Halifax being my wife and coheirs
in being but of Perfect mind and memory thanks be given to God. Therefore
calling to mind the Mortality of my Body and knowing that it is appointed
for all men once to die do make and Ordain this my last will and Testamen-
in that is to say Principally and first of All I give and bequeath my soul
unto the Hands of the Almighty God that gave it and my Body I commend
unto the Earth to be buried in decent Christian Burial at the Direction of
Executors with in dwelling but at the general Resurrection I shall revive
the same again by the mighty Power of God, and as touching such worldly & heli-
sh things as it has Pleased God to bless me in this life, I give, devise and bequeath of
the same in the manner and Term, First I give and bequeath to My dear
my Dearly beloved Wife the Plantation whereon I now dwell as long as she
remains my Widow likewise among them as named Lutes with her heirs
I own this Present time during her life likewise five Cows and Cattle as likewise
two work horses and two mares; Also I give to my well beloved Son John the
Acre and in the Plantation whereon I now dwell to be equally divided in tenancy
that is to say that my son John shall have the more Plantation, Also I give to my
D^r Brother John alias of Land joining the said Plantation above mentioned beginning
at the River bank extending up to Frederick Weillies line, as broad up on the
back line as up on the River Conditionally Paying the sum of Twenty Pounds
for the said. Also I bequeath unto my son John one negro Woman named Dick
and a Negress named Dick. Also I bequeath unto my son Alexander one
negro Slave the one named Stephen and the other Citty. Also I will unto my
Daughter Mary one Tract of Land or greater Tract joining of Bydes line
Containing three hundred and ninety five Acres Also Forty Pounds in Money
Also all such Cattle as are mentioned in her name at her death. I will unto my
Daughter Anne one Tract of Land or Bishops Creek Containing five hundred
Acres also Forty Pounds in Money. It is also my Will that there shall be a
right made to Joseph Trow of Taverham Dred Ponds lying in Bishop's Creek
wherein he now dwelleth. I also will unto my beloved Wife and my dear Children
all such sums of money that should come unto the Estate to be Equally
