In the Name of God. Amen I Hump Bailey
 Dally of the County of Halifax being sick and weak in body
 but of sound mind and memory do make this my last will
 and Testament in manner and form following. That is to say
 I desire first of all that all just Debts and funeral charges be paid
 Item it is my will and I do accordingly order that my executors
 hereafter manage so far as may be just Debts and funeral charges
 agreeable out of such wages of Sobs and Sale of such personal
 Estate of mine which they may most necessary to be spent in such
 manner as they may think best. Item I give and bequeath to my
 Daughter Polly Bailey my Negro man Slave named Anthony
 to her and her and offspring forever. Item I bequeath to my
 Well beloved wife Jane Bailey the Land and Plantation
 wherein I now dwell containing two hundred and ninety two
 Acres be the same more or less, also all the rest and
 residue of my Estate of every kind and nature during her natural
 life or widowhood. Item I give and bequeath unto my son
 Pleasant Bailey at the death or Marriage of my aforesaid wife
 the said Land and Plantation wherein I now dwell to him
 his heirs and offspring forever. Item I have heretofore given
 to my son Joseph E. Bailey the sum of Eighty pounds current
 money which sum I give to him his heirs and offspring forever
 as an equivalent with the rest of my children's portion in
 my Estate I item it in my will and I do accordingly order
 that my wife aforesaid may at any time before, or at her
 marriage or death divide the land and residue of my Estate
