I James Camp of Halifax County being sick of

ordain this ^{to be} my last Will and Testament revoking
all and every other Will and Wills by me made
either by Word or Writing and this is only to be my
last Will and devise my Debt and Dues that I
owe in Right or Conscience to any manner of Persons
or Persons be contented and paid or ordained to be
paid within a convenient time by my Executors
hereafter named and now touching such words
Relate as it hath pleased me in the Life I dispose
in form following I Give & bequeath unto John
Hammons one hundred and thirty Acres to be laid
upon the lower line and Running beginning James
Whittons line to the upper corner thence to the creek
thence down the creek running a line for quantity
to Obadiah Gents line not taking in the Spring in the
field over the creek to him his Heirs and Assigns
forever. Three plates one Corn one Old two Iron Wages
and all the rest what is not here after particular
mentioned to be divided between John & Robert Ham-
mons to them &c. To John the old Horse I give and
bequeath unto Robert Hammons fifty Acres from the
creek running a long the upper line to him his
Heirs and Assigns forever and one Black Colt to him
his Heirs &c. I give and bequeath unto Elizabeth
Hammons Ten Acres of Land over the creek taking the
Spring and a running up the creek that quantity to
her her heirs or assigns for ever and one Pot as long as
she lives on the Land two Plates two knives & Forks one
Daggon. I appoint John Hammons & Robert Ham-
mons Executors of this my last Will and Testament
I Witness hereof I have hereunto set my Hand & Seal
this twelfth day of June in the Year of our Lord God
one thousand seven hundred and eighty five
at the City of Philadelphia
