 Lord one thousand seven hundred and sixty one I Jeffery Crawley of the Parish of Saint
 Andrew in the County of Middlesex being very sick and weak and being full of
 mind and memory thanks to give unto God therefore calling unto mind the great duty of
 my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die do make and declare
 this my last will and Testament that is to say Principally and first of all I give and
 recommend my soul unto the hands of God that gave it and to my body I recommend it
 to the Earth to be buried in christianlike and decent manner at the discretion of my
 Executors nothing doubting but at the General Resurrection I shall rise to the same
 again by the mighty Power of God and do hereby give unto my Wife and to my
 Placed God to bless me with in this life I give away and dispose of the same in the following
 manner and Term. I give and dispose of it is my will and I desire that in the first place all
 Just Debt and several charges be Paid and satisfied. Then I give unto my Wife
 Wife Martha one negro Man named Peter together with all my stocks of cattle and horses
 and household goods and my work house and a young Bay mare and movables in
 her life. Then I do give to my well beloved Children after her decease all and singular
 my Estate to be divided among them and their heirs and assigns for ever. Then I give
 to my well beloved Benjamin Crawley one gray mare running at Thomas's charge
 and to my son Samuel Crawley one Bay mare now in his stable in and about that
 name of the gray mare two years old next spring and to Randolph Gibbs a bay mare
 that I had of Joseph Gibbs and she is told that runs at Leatherwood and carries
 Debt that is due to me in debt and she is told that runs away into Augustus or
 get him and attend of Topham Killings or William Walter and some in C. C.
 William Catterall's hands and some in James Tilly's hands and to Benjamin Gibbs
 Crawley four pounds eleven shillings and six pence that Daniel Dew owes me
 to John Hale at my yearling maw told that I had of him and I do hereby hereby
 disallow revoke and disannul all and every other former Testaments Wills Express
 and Executions by me in any way before this time made Made and by me
 Ratifying and confirming this and no other to be my last will and Testament in
 things whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the day and year above written

 by the said Jeffery Crawley as his last will and Testament
