First I give and bequeath to my well beloved son Lazarus Elliot Twenty Shillings
sterlin to him and his heirs forever.

Also I give to my son John Elliot two Negro men named Mingo and Pimus also
my Household goods and furniture stock and all the Cash due me by bonds bills and
open Accounts to him and his heirs for ever. And I do appoint my son John Elliot
and Joseph Gilt Executors of this my Will. In Witnes whereof I have hereunto set
my hand and seal this Ninth January one thousand seven hundred and
seventy three
