

Jeremiah Kure of the County of Halifax being of sound mind and memory do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament in which I dispose of my Estate both real and personal in the following manner (To Wit), Item first I give unto my son William Kure all that tract of land whereon I now live to him I give it and his heirs and assigns for ever. — Secondly I give unto my daughter Mary Nichols two hundred pounds to be paid her at the rate of fifteen pounds per annum by my two sons (to Wit, Abraham and William Kure) provided she should live so long as to draw the whole amount of the abovesaid if she should not then the balance after her death to be paid to her children at the same rate per annum (I mean the above sum of fifteen pounds to equally paid by my above mentioned sons annually). — Thirdly I give unto my two grand Daughters Nancy and Sally Cole Kures Daughters of my deceased son John Kure the sum of twenty pounds each to be paid by my two sons (equally) to Wit, Abraham and William Kure on their arriving to the age of twenty one years old or marriage and provided that either of my aforesaid grand Daughters should die before they come to that age or marry the survivor to receive the decedant's proportion. Fourthly I give all the remaining part of my Estate to my two sons Abraham Kure and William Kure consisting of whatever it may, to be equally divided between them, to them I give it and their heirs for ever, they first paying all my just debts and funeral expenses. — Fifthly and lastly I hereby appoint my two sons Abraham and William Kure the Executors to this my last will and Testament. In Testimony whereof I have unto set my hand and seal this sixteenth day of September one thousand eight hundred and two, hereby revoking all other wills and acknowledge this to be my last. —

In Testimony whereof I hereunto set my hand and seal this sixteenth day of September one thousand eight hundred and two, hereby revoking all other wills and acknowledge this to be my last.

The within written Last Will and Testament of Jeremiah Kune deceased, was exhibited in Court and proved by the oaths of three of the witnesses thereto subscribed and ordered to be recorded. And on the motion of Abraham Kune and William Kune the Executors therein named, who made oath according to Law. Certificate is granted them for obtaining probate thereof in due form, they giving security, Whereupon they together with John Britton and John B. Lott their securities entered into and acknowledged their bond in the penalty of ten thousand dollars Conditioned according to Law.
