 of Antrim being sick and Weak in body though of  
 perfect mind and Memory DO make this my Last  
 will and Testament that is to say after Recommending  
 my soul to the Mercy of of Almighty God and Body  
 to the Earth I do order my worldly Estate to be disposed  
 in Manner and form following - I give to my  
 Loving Brother Richard Apperson and to his Heirs  
 and Assigns forever all my lands which my father  
 Samuel Apperson bought of Thomas Gheen Sit-  
 ate in the County of Halifax and on the Branches of  
 Wynnow Creek & Terrible &c including my Newborn  
 House and the Court house of the S. County also six  
 Negroes I give to my said Brother Richard all my part  
 of Sundrie Negroes which are now in the possession  
 of another which was laid off to her for her share  
 &c It is also my will and I do accordingly Order  
 my Executors of whom I shall here after mention

To sell all my lands what my said Father bought  
of Maxton Green and Francis Jones situate in the  
County of Halifax and on the Branches of Dyffice  
It touch also all the Remainder of <sup>my</sup> personal Estate  
and the Monies Arising from such soil to be  
Applied towards paying my Funeral Charges  
and just Debts and the Remainder if any I Give to my  
loving Sister Martha Apperson It is also my will  
and I do hereby Order and desire my Trusty Friend  
Robert Wooding to take into his possession & sole  
Management - The Estate above given to my said  
Brother Richard Apperson and the same to con-  
tinue under the Management of the said Robert  
Wooding Untill my said Brother Richard shall  
Arrive to the lawful Age of Twenty one Years -  
I do also Constitute and Appoint my said friend  
Robert Wooding the Executor of this my last will  
In witness whereof I have hereunto set my Hand  
and seal this Fifth Day of September one thousand

 I give my Daughter Elizabeth one Negro Girl named  
 Patt and one feather bed and furniture and one  
 counterpin her Name thereon and one small horse  
 and two head young Cow kind one large Chest I give  
 to my Daughter Mollie one Negro Girl named Mollie  
 and one Cow and Cat, I send to my Daughter Judith  
 one Negro Girl named Sannoe one Negro boy named  
 Sam one feather bed and furniture and one counterpin  
 her Name thereon two head young Cow kind and  
 three silver tea spoon During her life and all  
 her Death I give all the thing lent her to be
