with a comfortable perception of common health but growing old and
infirm and balking to mind the mortality of all men. Knowing that it
is appointed for all men once to die. have constituted appointee and
ordained this my last will and testament. In manner and form
following. That is to say.

I Give to my well beloved wife Mary Guttery During her natural
Life or Widowhood the Land and Plantation whereon I now live Together
with all my Stock of every kind with all my house hold & Kitchen utensils
and Plantation utensils. And at her death or marriage my desire is that
my son Cason Guttery should have all the Land that I am Seised of at my
Death provided nevertheless that it is to be a home for my two Daughters Christy
Peters and Mary Guttery as long as they remain unmarried.

I Give to my son Cason Guttery after the death of my said Wife a pair of
of cattle one horse, bridle and saddle one feather bed and furniture one cow and Pigs and
one Iron Pot. I Give and bequeath to my three Daughters Elizabeth Peters
Francis Day and Mary Guttery all the rest residue and Remainder of my Estate
be it what nature kind or quality soever to be Equally Divided among them
at the Death of my said Wife and I appoint my well beloved wife Mary
Guttery Executor with my beloved friend James Mathews Executor to this my last will
and testament Signed, Sealed, published, and Declared this 10th day of September 1787

I Give to the Child that my wife is now with Child with to it
a Son or Daughter half the above mentioned Estate that I leave to my
Daughter Nancy Marshall and if either of them Die under
age or not married I Give that
