I John Fulkerson of Halifax County being of sound mind do make thus my last Will and Testament in the following manner, to wit, Item I bequeath unto my loving wife Sally Fulkerson after paying all my Just debts, all the Balances of my Estate both real and personal during her natural life and at her death it is my will and desire that all my land should be equally divided between my two sons, James and John, and it is my desire that as long as any of my daughters live single, that they may have the privilege of living on the land that I gave to my two sons and no longer, and it is my will and desire, at the death of my wife Sally Fulkerson, that all my personally Estate is to be equally divided between all my surviving children, I hereby appoint my loving wife Sally Fulkerson, Isham Button and Jonathan Vaper Executors to this my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking all former wills by me made In Witness whereof I hereunto set my hand and seal this thirty first day of March eighteen hundred and the

At a Court held for Halifax County the 27th day of June 1803

The within written last will and Testament of John Fulkerson deceased was exhibited in Court & proved by the oaths of two of the witnesses thereto Subscribed - and ordered to be accorded - and at another Court held for the said County the 20th day of September 1803 - The same was again exhibited in Court - and on the motion of Isham Button one of the Executors therein named - who made oath according to law: Certificate is granted him for obtaining probat thereof in due form - He giving security whereupon he together with John B. Scott and Henry E. Coleman his Co-Executors entered into and acknowledged their bond in the penalty of five thousand dollars conditioned as the law directs - Liberty being reserved to the other Executors & Administrators to join in the probat thereof when they shall think fit
