that it is appointed for all men once to die do make and ordain this my
last Will and Testament that is first of all I commend my hands of God the
giver of and commend my body to the earth to be buried in a decent manner
without any extraordinary charge hereafter named nothing doubting but
that my soul shall remain in the hands of God

God give me and touching my whole Estate wherewith I have been provided to
 me with Love and affection of my manners and form following. First I will that all
 my Just and Lawfull debts according to good Conscience be satisfied and paid
 within convenient Time after my decease at the Direction of my Executors
 Item I send to Sarah ~~W~~ my wife my house and Plantation where
 I now dwell which was this day before the signing of this Will conveyed to me
 by Deed from Francis Smith before such Will as by the same may appear
 together with one hundred and thirty Acres adjoining thereto as also all my
 household stuff Goods and Chattels Ready money Debts due by Account or
 any thing whatsoever may be found hereafter due to my Estate during the
 Term of her Life then save Land and Summe together with the Appurtenances
 I give to James Harris my eldest Son to him and his heirs for ever But the
 household stuff &c. if any thing remaine after my Wifes decease I will it may be
 Equally divided amongst my four Daughters I wit. Mary, Anne
 Martha and Elizabeth Harris to them and their heirs for ever as for
 rest of my Land conveyed this day as aforesaid I give and bequeath the
 rest of the same to witte my house and Land to John and Andrew Harris
 my Son to be Equally divided to them and their heirs for ever my other
 Sonny conveyed to me this day as at first mentioned I give and bequeath to
 Richard and James Harris my sons to be Equally divided to them and
 their heirs for ever Lastly I make constitute and appoint John Chesnut
 my friend and John Williams Daniel my Wifes Brothers and Sarah Harris
 my wife my only and sole Executors and Executrices of this my last Will
 Testament and I do utterly deny disallow and revoke all other wills
 bequestes or legacies heretofore mentioned Confirming this and
 in fully and Rightly to be my last will and Testament In
 Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and first my seal the Day
 is first above Written.
