seven hundred and sixty four I John Hamilton of Halifax County
being sick in body but of sound Memory thank to God and
calling to mind the uncertainty of this transitory life and
that all flesh must yield to Death

I do hereby declare and make manifest as a man and declare this my
 last Will and Testament in manner and form following
 nothing and annulling by these presents all and every
 Testament Will and Write heretofore by me made and
 declared either by word or writing and this to be taken only
 for my last Will and Testament and none other and first
 being penitent and sorry for my sins past most humbly
 desiring forgiveness for the same I give and commit my
 Soul into the hands of Almighty God my Saviour and
 Redeemer in whom and by the merits of Jesus Christ I trust
 to be saved and that my Soul with my body at the day of the
 Resurrection shall arise with Joy and through the merits
 of Christ's death and passion possess an Interest in the Kingdom
 of Heaven prepared for his elect and chosen and my body to be
 Buried in such place where it shall please my Executors hereafter
 named to appoint and now for the settling my temporal estate
 and such goods and chattels as it hath pleased God for above
 my debts to bestow and I do give and give the same in
 manner and form following that is to say first and I will
 that all the debts and dues as I be in right of conscience to any manner
 of Person or Persons whatsoever shall be well and truly paid
 or ordained to be paid within convenient time after my decease
 by my Executors hereafter named Item I give and bequeath to my
 well beloved Wife Jane all my personal Estate, if in the first place
 she survive and pays my four Daughters Mary, Jane, Sarah
 and Susannah the sum of forty pounds each to be paid at their
 coming to the age of Twenty one years. Item I give to my Son
 William Two hundred Acres of Land on the North Fork of
 Coleman's Creek adjoining to his late Mother's being part of the
 Tract of Land I do owe to him and his heirs for ever. Item I give
 to my Son John two hundred and sixty Acres of Land on the South
 Fork of Coleman's Creek adjoining his Mother's

him and his heirs forever. Item I give to my son John two hundred
and sixty acres of land on the north side main Coleman on adjoi-
ning his brother William to him and his heirs forever to extend down
to the lower end of the tract. Item I give to my son Alexander all the
remainder of land on Black Walnut Creek to him and his heirs forever.
Item I give to my son Benjamin Ware my land and Plantation
on South side Coleman to him and his heirs forever after my Wifes
decease. Lastly I do make certain Constitutions and Appoint my loving
Wife Jane Harrison William Neece and my brother Benjamin
Harrison my whole and sole Executors of this my last will and
Testament In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and
Seal the Date above written.
