 thousand seven hundred and sixty two I Peter Wilson of Adams
 County being very sick and weak in body and knowing that
 it is appointed for all men one time or other to die do make and
 Ordain this my last will and Testament. In the first place I will
 that all my Just Debts be duly paid and discharged Secondly my
 will is that my dear and loving wife Alice and my eldest son John be
 my Executors and Executors of this my last will and Testament.
 I lend unto my wife Alice Wilson six Negroes (Vizt) three males and
 three females namely Bet, Sue, Polly, Roger, Isaac, and Black Charles
 during her natural life and after her decease to be equally with
 their Increase divided among all seven children John, Agnes, Nancy,
 Peter, William, Isobel and Marguett. I also lend unto my wife Alice
 the land and plantation where I now dwell together with one
 hundred Acres of land I bought of Solomon Surrill also the Entry
 of four hundred Acres at the Back of the one hundred Acres to be her
 use during her natural life and no longer. I give and bequeath
 to my blood son John Wilson one tract of three hundred Acres of
 land on Hughes Creek lying on the Back of the hundred and
 sixty Acres I owed to him on the south side of said River I also
 give and bequeath to him my said son John two Negroes (Vizt)
 Yellow Charles and Frank to be for him his use and the use of
 his heirs for ever. I give and bequeath to my blood daughter
 Agnes Perkins one Negro boy named Bob to her and her heirs for ever.
 I give and bequeath to my daughter Nancy one Negro Girl named
 Lary to her and her heirs for ever. I give and bequeath to my son
 William the land and a plantation where I now dwell of two
 hundred and a sixty Acres of land and one Negro boy named
 Ned to him and his heirs for ever. I give and bequeath to my
 daughter Isobel one Negro Girl named Jean to her and her heirs
 for ever. I give to my youngest daughter Marguett one negro
 boy called Cyrus to her and her heirs for ever. I leave the twenty

parcels of land I had of David Gray on the North side of R. River
 and the three hundred twenty five acres of land at the Little morent
 which he has sold and four hundred acres of land on the double
 Creeks I bought of Waters all to be sold for the best price by my executor
 and Executor to raise money to pay my debts. my will is that my
 Estate may not be praised or Inventoryed. I give and bequeath to
 my son Peter one hundred acres of land I bought of Silvester Sunell
 together with the Entry of four hundred acres lying on the back of it
 also one negro boy named Pict to him and to his heirs for ever
 NB. my will is that neither Peter nor William must then neither
 on their land during her Natural life. My will is that the
 Tract of land on Sandy river called the Bare Garden be also sold
 to raise money to pay my debts by my Executors and Executor
 In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this
 this day and a year above written.
