equally Divided among my three Girls namely Eliza, Anney &
Sarah White to them and their heirs forever. — I Constitute and
Appoint my wife Anne White Executrix and my Son William White Attorney
to having last will and Testament, paid with Deciding all other affairs
of my estate even under my hands and seal this 15th day of May 1789.
