to Almighty God for the same. Yet considering the frailty incident to human
nature do make this my last Will and Testament in manner and
form as following VIZ: I Imprius I leave unto my beloved wife
Elizabeth Bowman all my Estate both Real and personal during
her life or widowhood, she not making waste thereof

Item after her death or marriage. I give as follows. I give unto
my five Children Alexander, Thomas, William, John & Eliza the
share whereon I now live to be Equally Divided among each of the
above named Boys paying unto their sister Anna and Dolly Forty
shillings to be Equally Divided between them the aforesaid sister
all the remainder of my Estate to be Equally Divided amongst my
above named Children should any of the above named Children die
before they come to the Age of Twenty One years, then those that are
Alive to divide what I have left them Equally. Lastly I nominate
Courtiers and appoint my son Alexander, Billy Bowman and
Fielding Bowman to be sole Executors to this my last will and Testament
hereby Resolving all others. Subscribed whereas I have hereunto set
my hands and seal the second day of May One Thousand Seven
and Ninety.
