In the name of God Amen I John Tinsley of Buckland Parish in the County of Halifax being in Perfect sense and memory praised to God with make Constitute and ordain this to be my last Will and Testament as Follows the Imprimis I lend to my wife Susanah all my Estate both Real and Personal during her Life. Item I give to my Daughter Agathe both Twenty Shillings Current money to buy her all things she having had Part of my Estate already. Item I give to my Daughter Rachel Gayell Twenty Shillings Current money to buy her all things she having had Part of my Estate already. Item I give to my son W. Maack Tinsley that Tract of Land he Purchased of Richard Beane & Co. in the County of Lincolnshire as aforesaid being had to the Queen. Item I give to my son John Tinsley and his wife married Simon also son of Thomas Tinsley and his wife Elizabeth twelve shillings and one Dozen of Eggs two Cows & a Horse. Item my assets and debts is and I hereby Order that my following Slaves to wit Sam, and Jay, together with all my Books of House, Cattle and household furniture be sold and after paying my Just debts and the money arisingly such sale be divided amongst my daughters as follows the Longest Tinsley shall have one Tinsley, Elizabeth Tinsley, Mary Tinsley and as much by Apportionment as Richard Jones Executors of this my last will and Testament as the same by my hand and seal at this Newberth the 10th of November in the Year of our Lord 1782 and there are seven hundred and eighty six.

 one of his Majesty's Justices for the County of Halifax do declare that they have
 Patrick Boyd on the day he departed this life in his own house Expressly desired
 to this Purpose. My Will and desire is that all my Stocks of better Hogs gether
 to sold and also all my Primeest Exlate breids be also sold and that the money
 arising by such sales after Paying my Just Duties be equally divided between
 my wife Anne and her two Children Richard and Henry. and that Eighty acres
 of Land belonging to me lying on the North side of Darr River be rented out
 for the two Children above mentioned unto the Age of Twenty one Years and
 then to be sold and the money arising by such sales to be equally divided
 between my two sons above mentioned. Certified under my hand the 26th
 day of January 1763.
