Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter Sarah Meadows forty five pounds to her and her heirs for ever. Item I give and bequeath unto the children of my son John Hubbard ~~de~~^{est to them}, forty five pounds to be equally divided among them, and their heirs for ever. Item I give and bequeath unto the children of my son Benjamin Hubbard ~~de~~, the sum of ten pounds to be equally divided between them and to them and their heirs for ever. Item I give and bequeath unto my son Samuel Hubbard after paying off the several legacies devised to and by legatus all the rest and residue of my estate both real and personal that is to say the tract of land whereon he now lives together with a small tract purchased of Howard and nine Negroes namely Luke Matt James Kitt Peter Eddy Sally Dick and Phil together with the children the increase of said Negroes Eddy as also my stock of all kinds household furniture &c. — and lastly I do appoint my friend James Hart William Smith and my son Sam^l Hubbard executors of this my last Will and Testament hereby revoking all other will or Wills by me heretofore made declaring this and this only to be my last will and testament In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 17th day of October 1799
