In the name of God amen I Jonah Sullens⁷ the parish of Antigonish
 in the County of Halifax being sick and weak in body but of sound and perfect
 memory thank be to God for the same and knowing the uncertainty of this earthly
 life do make and declare this my last Will and Testament in manner and form
 following viz first and principally I commend my Soul to God who gave it
 trusting in his mercy and in the merits of my dear Redeemer for the
 Remission of all my sins desirous my Body may be interred at the discretion
 of my executors hereafter named and as to the temporal estate that it pleases Almighty
 God to bestow upon me I desire that as much of my household goods and stock
 should be sold as will pay my just debts Item I desire that what is left of
 paying my debts my wife may have it I desire also that my wife may have
 the land wherein I now live during her widowhood or till my youngest son comes of
 age and then to be sold or if my wife marries before my youngest son comes of
 age then to be sold and the money to be equally divided between my three sons
 Lazarus, Jeph. and Joseph and my wife Lazarus. I leave my Brother John
 Sullen Esq^r. as witness my hand this 31 day of January 1773
