 Body but should he die without such issue then the said
 I give them to be his to my estate again and then to be equally divided
 amongst my children my desire is that my son James Warrington
 should keep his share that he has now in his possession and that my
 son John should have the share that he has in his possession and
 that my son James Warrington should have the share that he has
