

In the name of God amen. Lewis Wilborne of the County of
Stafford, being in perfect health of body, but of perfect mind and
memory, thanks be given unto God, calling unto mind the mortality of
my body, and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die, do make and
ordain this my last Will and Testament; that is to say principally and
first of all, I give and recommend my soul into the hands of almighty
God that gave it, and my body I recommend to the earth to be buried in
decent Christian burial, at the Discretion of my executors, nothing doubting
but at the General resurrection I shall receive the same again, by the mighty
power of God, and as touching such worldly estate where with it has
pleased God to bless me in this life, I give devise and dispose of the same
in the following manner and form. First I give unto my dearly beloved wife
Mary Wilborne all my lands and personal estate during her natural
life by her fully to be possessed and after her death. Second I give unto my
son in law John Whitlock and Mary Whitlock his wife one hundred
acres of land be the same more or less by the name of Clays tract during their
natural lives in case they live on the same and at their deaths I give the
land aforesaid to my grand son Richard Whitlock to him and his heirs for
ever also a good feather bed and furniture to be raised out of my estate also

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good horse bide and saddle the horse to be over three years old and under six
to him and his heirs for ever also a cow and calf. Third I lend to my son
in law Robert Page and Elizabeth Page one hundred acres of land be the same
more or less which I marked of joining William Vasser and George Vasser during
their natural lives or so long as they shall choose to live on it. Fourth all the
rest of my Estate lands and personal estate after my wifes Death to be
equally divided between my three children Robert Wilborne, Elizabeth
Page, and Mary Whitlock to them and their heirs for ever. Fifth I
likewise constitute, make, and ordain William Vasser & Melchizedek
Spragins sole executrix of this my last will and Testament, and I do hereby
utterly disallow, revoke, and disannul all and every other former Testaments
Wills by me in any wise before named Ratifying and confirming this and
no other to be my last will and Testament. In Witness whereof I have hereunto
set my hand and seal this fiftth day of November one Thousand seven
hundred and ninety Sixth.
