my day house and bed and furniture and all my Debts and Demands
and Cash—second I give to my sister Elizabeth Bostick my young Mare
and the best of the Stock that is to be mine—I give and Devise to my sister
Mary the tract of land whereon I have improved and till and all the rest
of my possession right tools and all other things that is found of mine—
after my Decease—My Will and Desire is that none of the boys shall have
any business in my affair William John Abraham nor that Abraham should
own have my Land nor part of it nor the Timber—and I Desire that the three
said Will Devise the Executors for not leaving and Abraham for making use of
the Estate and not giving any body any account of it.

Testamentary Words Spoken by Moses Bortick the 2^d day of May 1786 at his Mother the day before his Decease in presence of James Arnolds & Elizabeth his Wife being Cautioners of the approach of Death & as what he Deceased should be done with his Est. said that he Deceased that his sister Mary should have his Land & Mill if he should Die also his Choice of the three lots hereafter mentioned (to wit) his riding House also his Main & thereby a fether Rice a cow and calf & cows and Pigs my Rifle Gun smooth Bore & all my Working tools to be sold and Equally amongst the three parties the two lots mentioned after his sister Mary has her Choice he ordered to his other two sisters testified under our hands this 6th Day of May 1786

Attest in the evening the said day being as by John Crews which of all his brethren he desired should have his Land on which he replied if he should Die I want Mary to have the Land for that rather she should have it than any of the Rest
