In the name of God Amen the four
in the Year of our Lord Christ one thou-
sends and seventy two. I Nathan C.
Halifax County being sick and weak
perfect mind and memory thanks be
calling to mind the mortality of my Body
that I am appointed for all men once to die
I ordain this my last and Testament in manner
following that is to say principally and first
of all I give Praise to God who gave us breath
through the merits & merits of Jesus Christ my
Saviour to receive full pardon of all my sins to
communion & secure into Eternal Bliss and my Re-
gion to the Earth to be buried in a Christian like
decent manner at the discretion of my Executors
after mentioned and as touching such worldly
things with it hath pleased God to bless me I give

I give and bequeath unto my Son John Chapman three hundred Acres of Land lying in the County of Halifax on the head of deep Bottom Water and three Negroes Viz. Frank Dinor and Jades & their Increase likewise all my Stock of Horses & Cattle Hogs &c. with all my moveable effects except the Beds and he shall only have his first choice of Beds & the rest shall be divided among my four Children hereafter mentioned, but if in case my aforesaid Son John Chapman shall die without Heir my Will is that these Negroes and Stock &c. be equally divided between my four youngest Children Susanna Dillard Mary Chapman Sarah Chapman and Thomas Chapman & to them and their Heirs forever. I likewise give unto my aforesaid four youngest Children by me mentioned the Tract of Land wherein I now live on Jones River containing two hundred and five Acres, & that is that the said Land be sold and the money equally divided between my aforesaid four youngest Children & is mentioned and if any of the four Children should die without Heir part shall be equally divided between the remaining three Children & my Will is that my Son John Chapman shall keep the part of Estate that falls to my Son John Chapman until he comes of Age. Likewise my desire that my Daughter Susanna Dillard shall have a living upon the Tract of Land I have already given to my eldest Son John as long as she remains unmarried to be settled at the lower Spring. I leave I give to my eldest Daughter Ann Belling five ^{Planting} things and no more. I do likewise appoint my Son John Chapman Sole Executor of this my Will and Testament that he pay all my legal debts and legacies utterly resolving all other Wills made in case confirming this and he to be my Will and Testament.
