

In the Name of God Amen the thirtieth day of January 1773

Nathaniel Gibbs of the County of Staford and Colony of Virginia being sick and weak in body, but of sound and perfect Memory, blessed be God for the same, and knowing the uncertainty of this life, and that is appointed for all men once to die, do make and enact this my last Will and Testament, and first I give soul to God, and my body to the Earth from whence it came, to be buried in decent like manner as touching such worldly Estate as it hath pleased God to bless me with in this life, I give and dispose of the same in manner and form following, and it is my Will and desire that that all my just Debts and funeral Expenses be paid and satisfied.

Item I give and bequeath to my son Richard Gibbs one Shilling Sterling as his full part of my Estate forever — Item I give also to Thomas John Talbitha Sarahah Lucy and which were my Sons and daughters (Leaving together of my wife Sarahah Gibbs one Shilling Sterling each as their full parts of my Estate forever —

Item And it is my Will and desire that all the rest of my Estate be sold be sold by auction to the highest bidder in six months Credit, and the Money arising thereon is to be equally divided between my Grandson John York Gibbs and Peter Tomson, and I will and desire that the said Peter Tomson may remain in possession of my said money and Estate untill my Executor shall see Cause to sell the same at London which may be done as soon as they conveniently can — And I do hereby constitute and appoint Capt John Lawson, and William Boyde to be my Executors to execute this my last Will and Testament.
