

DEED COURT 1800

In the name of God Amen I Patrick Brady of Halifax County being of sound mind and memory maketh this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following to Wit first I do lend to my Mother Elizabeth Brady and my sister Elizabeth Brady during there natural life the whole of my lands and Tenements and it is my desire that after my death that my Nephew Jesse Wood should live on the plantation with my mother and sister & provide for there support and the support and raising the three children that now lives with me Viz William, Nancy and Sally Franklin and to pay all my just debts & at the death of my Mother Elizabeth Brady and Sister Lanner Brady, I do give and bequeath to my Nephew Jesse Wood his heirs and assigns forever the whole of my lands and Tenements; Viz fifty acres Land Willed me by my Father & 45 acres deeded me by ~~James Brady and Shokley Turner~~ but should my Nephew Jesse Wood fail to pay all my just debts, then it is my will and desire that at the death of my Mother & Sister that all my lands and Tenements shall be sold by my executor hereafter mentioned and all my just debts paid out of the money arising from the sale and the balance of the money after paying my debts if any, I give to my nephew Jesse Wood. I do hereby nominate and appoint my Nephew Jesse Wood Executor to this my last will and Testament hereby renouncing and revoking all other Wills by me here before made In Testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand this 26th day of August in the year one thousand seven hundred and Ninety Nine.

At a court held for Halifax County the 27th day of October 1800

The within written Last Will and Testament of Patrick Brady and was presented in Court and proved by the oaths of two witnesses thereto subscribed and ordered to be recorded. And at another Court continued and held for the said County on Thursday the 27th day of November 1800 ^{the} the accounts named in the ^{last} will and Testament of Patrick Brady dec. having by his letter directed to this Court concerned the execution of the said Will. Thereupon on the motion of James Bruce Gent. who made oath according to law and for reasons appearing to the Court. certificate for obtaining letters of administration of the estate of the said Patrick Brady dec. with his will aforesaid annexed is granted him by giving security whereupon he together with Isaac Coley jr. his security entered into and acknowledged their hand in the penalty of four hundred dollars conditioned as the law directs for that purpose
