In the name of God amen I Peter Hudson Son of Halifax County, and State of Virginia; being in
my perfect sound mind and memory, but not knowing the hour of death, with appointed once for all men to
die, do make this my last will and Testament in manner and form as followeth. Item I give to five of my
children, five shillings each, to wit, Lucretia Holland, Tabatha Womack, Sarah Vesper, Charles
Hudson, and Peter Hudson, Item I give to my son Greif Hudson and Patty Owen one curried calf
each - Item I give to my loving wife Mourning Hudson all my estate, real and personal, during
her life, after my just debts are paid, and after her death, I give to my son William Hudson, the
tract of land wherein I live, containing one hundred and twenty acres more or less, and all my personal
estate to him and his heirs forever. I must conclude with resigning my body to the earth, to be
buried

decently buried, at the direction of my wife Mourning Hudson, and son William Hudson, Lastly I do
appoint my loving son William Hudson exor: to my estate, Hoping he will serve truly and truly.
Witness my hand and seal this twentieth day of March in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred & thirty
three
