In the name of God amen the first day of October one thousand seven hundred and ninety two I Peter Truble of Halifax County

Halifax County, Virginia Wills 1792-1797
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being in perfect sense and memory do make and ordain this my Last will and Testament that is to say I bequeath and to Susannah Truble my wife all my household stuff, stock, and during her ^{life} natural, and to her will to ordered as she at her death as she shall devise. Item I give unto my son James Truble five shillings current money that is to say I have already given him

his part of Land I give and bequeath unto my son George Tribble
my Land on the East side of the creek. I am I give unto my Land where
I now live to my son Peter Tribble. I am I give my Land to each of them as
a home and to each of their heirs forever and I will that my property that
is my movables at my and my wife's Susannah Tribble's death that is
that is to say I give my daughter Ann Gray five shillings, and I give to my
daughter Susannah ~~Wood~~ ^{the wife of William Woosley} five shillings, I am
I give to my daughter Sarah Gelbeard five shillings. I am I give to my daughter
Dinah Woosley five shillings. I am I give to my daughter Prefilla five shillings
and I will that my movable Estate may at my death and my wife's death
may be equally divided between my three youngest children viz. George
Tribble, Peter Tribble, and Mary Tribble, lastly I make and constitute and
appoint David Owen James Tribble my son and Susannah Tribble

into and Acknowledged their ^{Bond} in the penalty of £100 conditioned according to
law, liberty being reserved to the other Executor to join in the probate
when he shall think proper
