

The last will and Testament of Phile Clark of the parish of Centum County of
Halifax -- I Phile Clark of the Parish and County aforesaid, being of sound mind and memory &
in good health, but reflecting the uncertainty of life do make this my last will & Testament, hereby
revoking all others, in manner and form following, that is to say -- after paying all my just debts,
I give and bequeath unto my son Messrs. Clark, to him and his heirs forever my two negroes named
Will, and Charlotte and her increase two feather beds and furniture, all my cattle, and all my lands, together
with any other article of property to me in any manner belonging or appertaining. Lastly I constitute & appoint
Hudson Clark my only executor of this my last will and Testament. In Witness whereof I have
hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 26th July 1800 & there

At a Court held for Halifax County the 23rd day of April 1806 --

The within written Last will and Testament of Phile Clark deceased, was exhibited in
Court, and proved by the oaths of two witnesses therein subscribed, -- and ordered to be recorded. And at the
same Court, continued and held for the said County the 24th day of the same month -- The same was
again presented in Court. And on the motion of Hudson Clark the executor therein named, who
made oath thereto according to law. Certificate is granted him for obtaining probate thereof in due form,
he giving security -- Whereupon he together with Isaac Belgis his security -- entered into -- and
acknowledges their bond in the penalty of five thousand dollars. Condemned as the law directs.

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Hawson Clark my only executor of this my last will and Testament. In witness whereof I have
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again presented in Court. And on the 24th day of the same month Philemon Clark the executor therein named, who
made oath thereto according to law: Certificate is granted him for obtaining probate thereof in due form,
he giving security - Whereupon he together with Isaac Bailey his security - entered into - and
acknowledged their bond in the penalty of five thousand dollars Conditioned as the law directs.
