 and William the Land I now live on Equally Divided
 John the upper part and William Macey the Lower
 Part to them and their heirs forever after my will is that
 maybe raised out of my estate one hundred and fifty
 Pounds and that my heirs buy a piece of Land with the
 same for Edward Macey also at my wife's Disease or
 Marriage my will is that all my Negroes that is not
 given in my will and stock with all there increase
 be Equally Divided among my Children also as I
 have sundry Books my will is that they may be
 sold to pay of my Debts and I do utterly Disallow
 and Disannul all former wills and bequestes by
 me before made allowing this and no other to be

my last will and Testament and further I do Const-
tute and appoint for my Ex^{ors} in this my last will
and Testament Paul Jareington John Tugue and
Joseph Tugue in witness whereof I have set my hand
and seal in the presence of Interlined when signed
Redford May 1791.
