At a Court Held for Halifax County the 21 Day of March 1771  
 This Will was exhibited into Court by William Hamlet  
 one of the Executors herein named the other Executor  
 refusing to take upon himself the Execution thereof  
 who made oath thereto according to Law and the  
 same being by the oaths of two of the witnesses above  
 was ordered to be Recorded and on the motion of the  
 said Executor Certificate was granted him for  
 obtaining a probate hereof in due form he having  
 with Edward Wade & Human Miller his securities  
 first entered into & acknowledged Bond according

 of October in the year of our Lord 1770 I Nelly  
 Griffin of Halifax in the County of Virginia being  
 very sick and weak in body but of perfect mind and

 it is appointed for all men once to die do make and ordain  
 this my Last will and Testament that is to say principally  
 and first of all I give and commend my soul into the hands

 Griffin Buckner Griffin wife Griffin and Elisha  
 Griffin to them and their heirs allas I give to my young  
 son Lucas Griffin my plantation whereon I now live  
 to him and his heirs but if that piece of land is abridge  
 to be sold to help to raise my children for the plan  
 to be sold and valued and to be equally Divided among the  
 but for the youngest to have the place and the re  
 mainder of my estate left to be equally Divided among all  
 children Ralph <sup>his</sup> Griffin signed sealed published  
 pronounced and declared by the said as his last will and  
 Testament in the presence of us the subscribers viz  
 Richard Griffin - John Rogers - John <sup>his</sup> Griffin -  
 Richard Griffin and William Night <sup>mark</sup> Norriton

At a Court held for Halifax County the 21<sup>st</sup> Day of March 1771 his Will was proved by the Oaths of two of the witnesses and Ordained to be Recorded.
