Virginia in the County of Halifax planter being very
sick and weak in body but of Perfect mind and memory
Thanks be given to God therefore calling unto mind
the Mortality of my body and knowing that it is
Appointed for all men once to Die do make and ordain
this my Will and Testament that is to say principally
and first of all I give and recommend my soul into
the Hands of God that gave it and for my body I com-
mend it to the Earth to be buried in a Christian like man-
ner at the Discretion of my Executors nothing doubt-
ing but at the General Resurrection I shall
Reave the same again by the Mighty Power
of God and as touching such worldly Estate
where with it hath pleased God to bless me in this
life I give Devise and Dispose of the same in the
following Manner and form ^{in witness whereof} I give and
Bequeath to Mary my Dearly beloved wife Three
Negroes London Sam and Jip and all the rest of
my Estate Real and personal I Likewise do
Ordain and appoint Loving Wife Mary Rogers and
David Wall Executors of this my last Will and
Testament and I do hereby utterly Disallow
Revoke and Disannull all and every other for-
mer Testament or Obligation Requests and Execu-
tors by me in any ways before this time made Will
and Bequeathed Ratifying and Confirming this
and no other to be my last Will and Testament
in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand
and Seal the day and Year above Written Richard
Rogers signed Sealed Published by the said Richard
Rogers as his last Will and Testament in the

At a Court held for the County of Madison the 21 day of June 1770

The within last will and Testament of Richard Rogers

Deceased was exhibited in Court by Mary Rogers his Widow Relict and Executrix and David White Executors thereof Appointed who made oath thereto according to Law and the same being proved by the Oaths of the subscribing Witnesses was ordered to be recorded and the said Executrix and Exor. having with Nathaniel Ivory Gent their security entered into Bond for that purpose and it is acknowledged the same on their Motion Certificate was granted them for obtaining a probate of the said Will in due form
