 lives for his life and his his present Wife's Widows
 head if he leaves her behind after which I give the
 said Land to his Son Benjamin to him and
 his heirs forever but if my Son Jacob should want
 to sell it in his life he is at liberty so to do provided
 he gives his Son Benjamin the value of it at his
 Death likewise Negroe Rachael and her fu-
 ture Increase I lend ^{him} during his life only the
 first from now to be Benjamin's his Sons
 or the first of her future increase that lives to
 the Age of twenty one She and the rest of her fu-
 ture increase I leave at my Son's Death to be equal-
 ly divided amongst the Children he has by his
 present Wife or may have hereafter
