In the name of God amen. I Robert Throckmorton of the County of Halifax being sick & weak & in a low state of health but of sound mind & memory thanks be god for the same - I do make this my last Will and Testament. Revoking all other Wills heretofore made by me - my Sole I commit to almighty God - And as to my worldly goods I give in manner following that is to say. Item I give and bequeath to my Son Henry Throckmorton all my tract of land and plantation where I now live - particular reserving one third part of the said lands including the houses and orchard where I now live unto my beloved wife Elizabeth.

Throckmorton during her natural life and at her death my will and desire is that
my son Henry Throckmorton shall immediately possess & enjoy all which I have bequeathed
to my wife: Item my will and desire is that if my son Henry Throckmorton should
die before he comes to the age of twenty years - that my wife Elizabeth Throckmorton
shall have immediate possession of the lands which I give him and all the profits
arising therefrom. During her life and at her Death. My will and desire is
that the said lands shall be sold and the money arising from such sale to be equally
divided Betwixt my surviving Children I constitute and appoint my Wife Elizabeth
the Executrix of this my last Will & Testament. Witness my hand this 4th May 1800.
