kind household furniture Negroes &c. It is my will and desire is that at the death of
my beloved wife that my land should be equally divided between my two sons to wit, Septimus
and Francis Taylor if one of my sons die without having an heir is the other should have the
all the land. It is my will and desire that at the death of my said wife Elizabeth Taylor that the
aforesaid mentioned land with the stock of every kind household and citchen furniture negroes and
the hole and soal of my estate Except my land to be equally divided between my four children
to wit, Margaret, Nancy, Septimus and Francis Taylor. And Lastly I do appoint nominate &
ordain my beloved wife Elizabeth Taylor executrix with Francis Brandon and William
Brandon Executors of this my last Will and Testament hoping they will see the same duly
performed as my trust is in them reposed. In Witness whereof I have set my hand and seal this
28th day of January Eighteen hundred, sealed, signed acknowledged and declared to be his last will
and Testament.

Then my will and desire is that at the death of my said wife Elizabeth Taylor that the aforesaid mentioned land with the stock of every kind household and citchen furniture negroes and the hole and soal of my estate Except my land to be equally divided between my four children to wit. Margaret, Nancy Septimus and Francis Taylor. And Lastly I do appoint nominate & ordain my beloved wife Elizabeth Taylor executrix with Francis Brandon and William Brandon Executors of this my last will and Testament hoping they will see the same duly preformed as my trust is in them reposed. In Witnes whereof I have set my hand and seal this 28th day of January Eighteen hundred, sealed, signed acknowledged and declared to be his last will and Testament.

The within written Last Will and Testament of Septimus Taylor deceased was exhibited in Court and proved by the oaths of two of the subscribing witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded. And on the motion of Francis Brandon and William Brandon the Executors therein named

June Court 1801

Who made oath according to law Certificate is granted them for obtaining probat thereof in due form they giving security whereupon they together with Thomas Branden (P. H.) and Richard Perryman their securities entered into and acknowledged bond in the penalty of three Thousand dollars conditioned as the law directs. Liberty being reserved to the Executors therein named to join in the Execution thereof when she shall think fit.

I leave to my wife after a division a negro girl named Fanny a horse and saddle a better house and land to be divided when I am dead.
