

December Court 1789

The Douglas. In the name of God Amen. The thirteenth day of November in the
 year of our Lord Christ one thousand seven hundred & eighty three. I Thomas Douglas
 of Sussex County being sick & weak of body but of Perfect mind & memory do
 make this my last will & Testament in manner and form as follows that is to say
 I do commend my soul into the hands of all mighty God
 that gave it nothing doubting but that I shall receive it again at the year
 resurrection and to my body to be buried in a decent and Christian like manner
 at the discretion of my Executors; and as touching such worldly Estates as where with
 has pleased God to bless me I give and dispose of in form & manner as follows
 First it is my will & desire that all my just debts be paid. Second I give
 bequeath to my son John a Negro Woman named Betty as also a Negro
 named Charles to him and his heirs forever. Thirdly I give and bequeath to
 son William a Negro man Cook to him & his heirs forever. Fourthly I
 give and bequeath to my daughter Sarah a Negro boy named Quincy to him and
 his heirs forever. Fifthly it is my will & desire that — if my Negro woman
 being another child within twelve months from the date hereof that my daughter
 Lane receive it a black child I give & bequeath to her & her heirs forever. Sixtly
 I give & bequeath to my daughter Nancy a Negro girl named Prann to him and
 his heirs forever. Seventhly I give and bequeath to my son Thomas the tract
 of Land wherein I now live containing by Estimation two hundred Eighty four
 acres or so it is a Negro woman named Apple as also a Coffee Mill containing a hundred
 forty five gallons to him and his heirs forever. Eighthly I give & bequeath to my
 daughter Sarah and Lane as also Nancy each of them a bed & furniture to
 & their heirs. Ninthly I give and bequeath to my daughter Sarah
 as also Nancy two cows & calves to each of them and their heirs forever.
 Tenthly It is my will & desire that all my Negroes remain on this my
 plantation wherein they now are the ensuing year as also the Stock which I have
 both at home & also at the South shop as also all the working tools belonging to
 the plantation be for the use of the Plantation and remain in the hands of
 my son John the ensuing year. Eleventhly I give and bequeath to my son Thomas
 a young barrel mare as also three Cows to him & his heirs forever. Twelfthly
 It is my will and desire that my son John have a fourth part of the Crop
 of Tobacco that was made on my Plantation this year it being this year
 as my business and also the remainder that all my just debts be paid first
 with and the Surplus be applied to the schooling of my children Thomas & Nancy
 further it is my will and desire that if it please God to send a Crop in the
 Plantation the ensuing year my son John shall have the Fifth Part of the
 Corn and the fourth Part of the Tobacco the other parts shall be divided
 between my daughter Sarah and Lane as also Nancy each of them

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the remainder of my house I have bid to be equally between Ann both to them and their
heirs forever; I give and bequeath as also it is my will and desire that
the remainder of my cattle and household furniture without being made sale of
or sold, ^{the} remainder of my whole effects be equally divided amongst my
children hereafter named that is to say John, Elizabeth, Mary William, Jane,
Thomas & Nancy to them and their heirs forever; I give to my daughter
Mary my best Lyon pett, to her and her heirs forever Item I do hereby
create and appoint my son John sole Executor of this my last Will and
Testament Concerning I do authorize I utterly renouncing all former gifts or be-
quests made or Testaments herebefore by me given, ^{wanted} or made
hoping, owning & confirming this and no other to be my last will and Testament
that I well have devised after my death In witness whereof I have hereunto
set my hand & affixed my seal the sixth year above said in
Wigmore Hall and Declared so in the said Thomas Langlofe to be his last will & Testament In

At a Court held for Gallop County the 29 Day of December 1799
The last will and Testament of Thomas Dangleas dec^d was exhibited into
Court and proved by the oath of three of the Subscribers aforesaid thereto to be the
last and sole of the said Thomas dec^d and was ordered to be recorded & an Execu-
tion of John Dangleas the Executor therein named who made Oath according
to Law to execute the same for obtaining Probate in due form of the said Estate
was granted him in given Docket whereupon he together with David Boyd
and William Golpham Es^{rs} Executors entered into said Docket their
Bonds for that purpose according to Law
