The within written Last Will and Testament of Isaac Wilson deceased was exhibited in Court and proved by the oaths of two of the witnesses thereto subscribed and ordered to be recorded. - And on the motion of Jacob Ferguson the Executor therein named, who made oath according to Law: Certificate is granted him for obtaining probate thereof in due form, he giving Security: Whereupon he together with Byrd Womack his security, entered into and acknowledged their bond in the penalty of two thousand dollars, conditioned as the Law directs.

In the Name of God amen I Thomas Sacy Senr of Halifax County and State of Virginia, being in a low State of health, but of perfect mind and memory do make, constitute and ordain this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following VIZ, I am Sign and bequeath to the children of my deceased Son Elisha Sacy (VIZ), Iatun, Elisha, Thomas, and Biny Epps Sacy the sum of twenty Shillings each to be paid them respectively by my Executors when a distribution of my Estate shall take place. - I am Sign and bequeath to my son Matthew Sacy, and his heirs and assigns forever, part of the tract of land which I now live, to contain one hundred acres, to begin where Russis line & Chapman's

lines corner, and to continue on Chapmans line for quantity, I also bind to my said Son, my negro girl
Bridget, during his natural life and at his death, I give and bequeath the said slave Bridget with
her future increase to my Grand daughter Petsy Roberts, daughter of said Mather Lucy reserving the title
in me so far that if the said Petsy Roberts shall die without an heir of her body living at her death to
give the said negro girl Bridget with her future increase to my Son Askin Lucy, to whom I give the said
negro with her future increase to him his heirs and assigns forever. — I also give and bequeath to my
said Son Askin Lucy all the residue of my lands and my two negro slaves, named Jefe and Chanis with
their future increase. But if in case the said Askin shall die without any heir of his body lawfully
^{legitimate} then it is my will that the said slaves Jefe and Chanis with their future increase be equally divided amongst all
my legates, I also give my said Son Askin ^{Halifax County Virginia Wills 1798-1804} ^{www.virginiapioneers.net} ~~my negro slave named Ursula~~, and one feather bed and furniture. — Item
I bind to my daughter Drusilla Pound my negro slave named Ursula, during her natural life, and at the death of
the said Drusilla Pound it is my will, the said Negro Slave with her future increase be equally divided
amongst all the children of the said Drusilla, to whom I give the said slave to them their heirs and assigns forever.
Item I bind to my daughter Magdaline Abbott my negro girl Siger, during her natural life and at her death, to
be divided with her future increase amongst all the children of said Magdaline to whom I give said slave
with her future increase, to them their heirs and assigns forever. Item I bind to my daughter Christian Godby
my negro girl Phillis, during her natural life, and at her death, I give the said slave Phillis with her future
increase, to be equally divided amongst all the children of the said Christian Godby. — Item I bind to my
daughter Sally King during her natural life my negro girl Slave named Polly and at the death of the said
Sally King the said Polly with her future increase to be equally divided amongst all the children of the said Sally King.

increase, to be equally divided amongst all the children of the said Christian Godby. — Item I bind to my daughter Sally King during her natural life my negro girl slave named Polly and at the death of the said Sally — I give the said slave with her future increase to all the children of the said Sally King to be equally divided amongst them — Item it is my will that after the payment of my last debts, that the residue of my estate be equally divided amongst all my living children; and I do hereby appoint my two sons Matthew and Reuben Sacy Executors to this my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking all others wills by me made, and acknowledging this only to be my Will. — In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 31st day of August 1802

I Thomas Sacy of Halifax County being of sound mind and memory, do hereby acknowledge the within three pages to be my last will and Testament, ^{Halifax County Virginia Wills 1798-1804} ^{www.virginiapioneers.net} and do hereby make this further provision for my son Reuben Sacy, vizt, In addition to the legacy I have given him in the body of this will I give and bequeath to my said son Reuben Sacy, my sword, one sword and peg, six pewter plates, one pewter dish, and pewter basin and one hen pot, also one equal half of my crop of Tobacco, and a sufficiency of corn and meat for his family. Also for one year to whom I give the above mentioned property to him his heirs and assigns forever. In Testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this twelfth day of December in the year of our Lord 1802.
