 Past most Humbly desire forgiveness for the same
 I give and bequeath my soul to Almighty God my sa-
 viour and Redeemer in whom and by the merits
 of Jesus Christ trust and believe assuredly to
 be saved and to have full Remission and for-
 giveness of all my sins and my soul with my
 body at a General day of the Resurrection
 shall rise again with joy and through the
 merits of Christs death and passion pass
 and inherit ^{the} Kingdom of heaven prepared for
 his elect and Chosen and my body to be buried
 in such a place where it shall Please my
 Executors hereafter named to appoint and
 now for the settling of my Temporal Estate
 and such Goods as it hath pleased God for
 above my deserts, to bestow upon me I do
 order give and dispose the same in manner
 and form following Here I give my loving
 Wife my whole and sole Executor during her
 natural life and then to be equally divided
 Among all my Children. Item I give my
 plantation and forty Acres of Land there
 to, to my son John and his heirs forever.
 Item I give the Rest of my Land to be equally
 Divided between my other four sons to them
 and their heirs forever and none of them to
 sell their Part but to convey them and if either
 of my sons die without heir their Land to fall
 to my Daughter Sarah and her heirs forever
