

In the name of God amen. I Thomas Stovall of Halifax County and State of Virginia being of perfect mind and memory but apprized of the uncertainty of human life, do make and ordain this, my last will and Testament; to wit,
In the first place, recommend my immortal Soul to the Mercy of God who gave it to me and my mortal body, to the earth from whence it proceeded therein to be decently buried, at the discretion of my Executors to be hereafter named. As to my worldly goods, with which kind providence has endowed me, I first give and bequeath unto my eldest daughter Sarah Barton one feather bed and furniture one cow and calf formerly lent her, and now in her possession to her and her heirs forever, -
Secondly I give and bequeath to my son Bartholomew Stovall that tract of lands on which he formerly lived consisting of one hundred and seventy four acres be the same more or less lying upon the draughts of Hunting Creek which said Bartholomew sold to Giles Thwaitt, also one horn and saddle one cow and calf and one bed and furniture having had possession of the same to him and his heirs forever; thirdly I give and bequeath unto my daughter Tabitha Thize one feather bed and furniture one cow and calf of which she is already possessed to her and her heirs forever; fourthly I give and bequeath unto my daughter Phebe Owen a parcel of land to be laid off and taken from the north eastern end of the tract on which I now live; which said parcel of land is to be bounded by William Owen Spring branch, beginning at the line of the land of Thomas Clarke deceased & thence up the spring branch to the spring including the same thence a straight line to the nearest post oak being a marked tree upon Phebe Owen's line - which said parcel of land is computed at thirty acres be the same more or less and includes the settlement on which the said William Owen and Phebe his wife now lives also one feather bed & furniture and one cow and calf now in her possession all which I give and bequeath to her and her heirs forever fifthly I give and bequeath unto my daughter Ruth Owen one feather bed and furniture and one cow and calf being in possession of

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bequeath unto my daughter Betty Ann Owen one feather bed and furniture and one cow and calf being in possession of
the same to her and her heirs for ever. — Sixthly — I give and bequeath unto my daughter Rebecca Dickerson one feather
bed and furniture one cow and calf being possessed of the same to her and her heirs for ever. — Seventhly — I give & bequeath unto
my daughter Sally Dickerson — one feather bed and furniture one cow and calf being possessed of the same also a negro girl
same to her and her heirs for ever. — Eighthly — I give and bequeath unto my daughter Lueky Woodall one feather bed and furniture
and one cow and calf being possessed of the same to her and her heirs for ever. — Ninthly — I give and bequeath unto my son
George Storall my negro man Tobe one feather bed and furniture one cow and calf one horse and saddle being possessed of the same
also I give and devise to my said George Storall all the land I now live on including a late entry considered as a part of it;
saving the described parcels of land devised to my daughter Phoebe Owen, — all which I give, bequeath and devise to the
said George Storall and his heirs for ever. — Tenthly it is my further will and desire that my negro wench Kate with her child
Isaac and future increase prior to my death together with all the rest and residue of my estate not heretofore expressly given
away shall be set up at publick auction and sold for ready money; which money it is my desire shall be equally divided
between all and every of my children before named, my son George Storall excepted after first paying my debts if any of funeral
expenses — I do constitute and appoint my friends George Banington and Thomas Dohm Executors of this my last will and
Testament revoking all others. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my my hand and affixed my seal this 13th day
of January 1798.

September Court 1813

At a Court held for Halifax County the 25th day of July 1813

The within written Last Will and Testament of Thomas Stovall deceased was exhibited in Court and proved by the oaths of two of the Witnesses thereto subscribed — and ordered to be recorded — And at another Court held for the said County the 26th day of September 1813 — The same was again exhibited in Court — And on the motion of George Camington & Thomas Dehon the Executors therein named — who made oath according to law — Certificate is granted them for obtaining probat thereof in due form — They giving Security — Whereupon they together with John Clark and James Eastham their Securities — entered into — and acknowledged their bond in the penalty of three thousand dollars — Conditioned as the Law directs —
