In the name of God Amen I Thomas Tuck of
Halifax County and Parish of Anttrim being weak in Body
The of Sound mind and Memory Do make this my last will
and Testament in manner and form as follows that is to say
I lend to my loving wife Sarah Tuck for and during the term
of her natural life and no longer my whole Estate both
Real and Personal and after that period it is my will
that my said Estate and the increase thereof be divided as here
after Directed that is to say I Give and bequeath to my son
Thomas Tuck and to his heirs and Assigns forever my tract
of land whereon I now live containing one hundred and
fifty acres more or less, and the Personal Estate such
as Slaves, Stocks of Cattle hives hogs household Goods &c
&c I Give and bequeath to my other children to wit, John
William Mary Wathens Sarah Tuck Susannah Malene
Rebekah Nancy & Susella to them and their heirs or
Assigns forever or the Survivor of them to be equally
Divided among them according to the Discretion of
three good men to be chosen for that Purpose the
Determination of either two of whom shall be final
Them. It is also my will & I do hereby constitute and
appoint my friend Mr George Camp the Executor of this
my last will I in witness whereof I have here to
set my hand and seal this Twenty fifth day of
April one thousand seven hundred & eighty six
