give and bequeath to my son Henry a young black mare about one
year old - The Residue of my Estate both Real and Personal I leave
unto my beloved wife Judith Chandler among her several life, and
after her decease I give and bequeath it as followeth - I give and bequeath to my son Daniel that Part of my land which
is bounded as followeth (to wit) Beginning at the stone Creek at
the mouth of the Timber Lake Branch, being the first Branch that comes into
the creek above John Baines spring branch, thence up the said Timber Lake
Branch to the head thereof, and from thence a straight line to the said Baines
