JUNE COURT 1789

In the name of God. Amen, the fourth day of February in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred eighty nine William Buck of the County of Halifax being sick & weak in body but of perfect mind & memory, thanks be given unto God, therefore making mind the mortality of my body, & knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die, Do make & ordain this my last will & Testament that is to say, principally I part of all I give & recommend my soul unto the hands of God that gave it & for my body I recommend it to the earth, to be buried in a Christian like & decent manner at the discretion of my Executors nothing doubting, but at the general Resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty power of God, I as touching such worldly Estate, wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me in this life, I give & dispose I dispose of the same in the following manner I do Imprimis I give & bequeath to my friend & well beloved William Spoor of this my last Will & Testament, all singular my Cards Manuscripts & Inuments by him freely to be disposed & enjoyed & so he be utterly released, absolved & sworn all & every other former Testament, Will, & Legacies, bequests by me in any ways before this time named Will & bequeathed retifying & confirming this & no other to be my last Will & Testament. The within written last Will & Testament of William Buck (decd) was exhibited unto Court & proved by the Oaths of 2 of the Witnesses thereto subscribed to in the last Will of the said Buck (decd) & ordered to be recorded. And on the motion of William Spoor (for motion appearing) was appointed Administrator with the Will annexed of the said Buck (decd) was granted him in giving Bond, & security & taking the Oath according to
