In the name of God amen I Jonah Sullens⁷ the parish of Antigonish
 in the County of Halifax being sick and weak in body but of sound and perfect
 memory thank be to God for the same and knowing the uncertainty of this earthly
 life do make and declare this my last Will and Testament in manner and form
 following viz first and principally I command my Soul to God who gave it
 trusting in his mercy and in the merits of my dear Redeemer for the
 Remission of all my sins during my Body may be interred at the discretion
 of my executors hereafter named and as to the temporal estate that it pleases Almighty
 God to bestow upon me I desire that as much of my household goods and stock
 should be sold as will pay my just debts; Item I desire that what is left of
 paying my debts my Wife may have it I desire also that my Wife may have
 the land wherein I now live during her widowhood or till my Youngest son comes of
 age and then to be sold or of my Wife marriage before my youngest son comes of
 age then to be sold and the money to be equally divided between my three Sons
 Lazarus, Jeph. and Joseph and my Wife Lazarus. I leave my Brother John
 Sullens Esq^r. As witness my hand this 31 day of January 1773

Item I give and bequeath to my Brother John Cruse three youngest Children, to wit, Elizabeth, John, and Martha Cruse five pounds Court money if to be had, to be equally divided amongst three children.

Item I give and bequeath to my Brother Walter Cruse three youngest Children, to wit, Ann, Walter and Stephen Cruse ten pounds Court money if to be had, to be equally divided amongst them three Children.

Item I give and bequeath to my Sister Elizabeth Mearns three youngest Children, to wit, Mary, Elizabeth and Agnes eight pounds Court money if to be had, to be equally divided amongst them three children.

Item I give and bequeath to my Sister Mary Richardson and her Children, my Bedding Mass Saddle and bridle with all my Weaving Cloths and what money I have with me also a pair of fine Linning at the house of John Taugeron in York County.

Lastly I do appoint John Taugeron my Whole and sole Exec^t to have my last Will and Testament In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this
19th day of February 1773.
