of Halifax, being sick of body, but of a disposing mind & memory, do make this my last Will
& Testament, in manner and form following (To Wit) I give and bequeath unto my brother John
Dickie & his heirs for ever my negroe man named James, I also bind him my negroe woman named
Lucy, so long as the said John Dickie may live, & at his decease I give and bequeath the said negroe
woman unto my Nephew William Dickie & his heirs for ever, my old negroe woman named
Sarah, I desire may be set free, now the rest and residue of my Estate (viz) Land, Stock of all
kinds I possess, my last household furniture &c may be sold for cash, and the money arising
therefrom after my just debts and funeral expenses are paid, I give and bequeath to my sister
Elizabeth Chappell & my friend Edwin Garlington Sen^r to be equally divided between them
and their heirs for ever. I do hereby appoint John Dickie & Edwin Garlington Sen^r Executors of
Elizabeth Chappell Executrix of this my last Will & Testament, in Witness whereof I have
hereunto set my hand & seal this the seventh day of December Eighteen hundred & four.

The within written Last Will and Testament of William Pickie deceased was exhibited in Court and proved by the oaths of two of the witnesses thereto subscribed & ordered to be recorded. And on the motion of Edwin Farlington Sen^r one of the Executors therein named who made oath according to law Certificate is granted him for obtaining probate thereof in due form giving security whereupon he together with George Carrington & David Brandon his securities entered into & acknowledged their bonds in the penalty of five thousand dollars conditioned according to law. Liberty being reserved to John Pickie the other Executor & Elizabeth Chappell the Executrix therein named to join in the execution thereof when they shall think fit.
