In the name of God Amen I Thomas Sambough of Halifax County being in perfect Sense and Memory and knowing it is appointed for all men here to die do make and Ordain this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following. I Recommend my Soul to Almighty God that gave it me trusting in the Ever Blessed Jesus to receive it again in a future Resurrection my body I desire may be Buried in a decent Manner at the discretion of my Executors hereafter named and as for what Worthy Estate it has pleased God to bless me with, after my natural Expence and just debts are paid I dispose of in the following manner. I Give and Bequeath unto my son Thomas Sambough twenty shillings Current money. I Give and Bequeath unto my son Anderson Sambough twenty shillings Current money. I Give and Bequeath unto my Daughter Sally twenty shillings Current money. I Give and Bequeath unto my son William the land and Plantation whereon I now live to him and his heirs forever only my wife to have free Privilege during her life. I Give the remainder part of my Estate I lend to my wife Mary during her natural life in Widowhood and then I Give it to my son William and his heirs forever. I Appoint my wife my Executors and my son William my Executor to this my Last Will and Testament In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 25th day of July 1791.
