

I William Toller of Halifax County being in perfect & sound memory do make this my last Will & Testament. My Will and Desire is that my Tract of Land near Mico River (Adjoining the Lands of M^r Roger Atkinson & others) shall be sold as soon as is convenient after my son William shall be of Lawfull Age to demand His part of the Money that it shall be sold for, and I desire that My Executors hereafter mentioned or any one or more of them that shall undertake the Executorship shall & may make a good & sufficient Deed to the person that shall purchase the same Item I desire that After my just Debt shall be paid What Remains of my Estate shall be Equally Divided Amongst My Wife Jane & my Children (that is to say) the Division to be made when my Land is sold & the Money Received for the same. Nevertheless if my personable Estate shall fetch more than will pay my Debt, that then I desire my Wife Jane shall have What Remains Over paying the said Debt but shall Account for the same out of What may be coming to her after my Land is sold. Now I do appoint William Stokes Andrew McCool & John Armstrong to be Executors of this my last Will & Testament. In Witness Whereof I have hereunto set My hand & Seal this thirteenth Day of January 1767 signed sealed & published in presence of Joseph England Sarah Stokes Daniel J. Dean Mary X. McCool William Toller Seal. At a Court held for Halifax County the 19 day of March 1767 The within last Will and Testament of William Toller Deceased was Exhibited & read by John Armstrong Executor therein appointed & who made Oath thereto According to Law and the same was proved by the Oaths of two of the subscribing Witnesses and Ordered to be Recorded and on the Motion of the said Executor who having first together with James Legrand John Boyd his securities entered into Bond as the Law Direct & Acknowledged the same Certificatt is granted him for obtaining a probate of the said Will in due form and liberty is granted to William Stokes and Andrew McCool the other Executors therein also appointed join in the probate aforesaid when they shall think fit.
