thousand eight hundred and three - I William Moor of Halifax County Virginia being sick and
weak in body but of perfect mind and memory thanks be given to God for the same recalling to
mind the mortality of the body and knowing that it is appointed once for all men to
die do make and ordain this my last will and Testament that is to say - Principally and first of
all I give and recommend my soul into the hands of God that give it and for my body I recommend
it to the Earth to be buried in a Christian like and decent manner at the discretion of my Executors
and as touching such worldly Estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me with in this life I
give ^{devise} and dispose of the same in manner and form following to wit, In the first place I give
and bequeath to Rhoda my beloved wife all my Estate together with my household goods and moveables
by her fully to be possessed and enjoyed, and I likewise constitute and ordain her my only and sole
Executrix of this my last will and Testament, And I do hereby disallow revoke and disannul all
and every other former wills and Testaments ratifying and confirming this and no other to be my
last will and Testament - In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the

William Mow

At a Court held for Halifax County the 26th day of December 1803 —

The within written Last will and Testament of William Mow deceased — was exhibited in Court — and proved by the oaths of ^{Halifax County Virginia Wills 1798-1804} ~~their witnesses~~ ^{www.virginiapioneers.net} and admitted to be executed — And at another Court held for the said County the 27th day of February 1804 — And On the motion of Rhoda Mow the executrix named in the said last will and Testament, who made oath according to law: Testimony is granted her for obtaining probate thereof in due form — She giving Security, Whereupon she together with Richard Lister and John G. Powell her securities — entered into and acknowledged their bond in the penalty of three thousand dollars — conditioned as the law directs.
