Terrell, it is my wish and Desire for my negroes to be loted off into ten lots as Equal
as possible and Drawn for by the Legates or how they may Direct To, prevent any
Disputes among my Children. I wish and Desire for a Division to take place within
Twelve months after my Death and if it should not be convenient for all the Legates
to attend they Division I Apoint my Son James Terrell to act for them in the
Division. I also Apoint him one of they Dividers of my Estate and Any two others
as the Legates may Chuse but if any of the first mentioned Children should die
without a lawfull begotten heir of her or her body then that part of my Estate
that is allotted to him or her shall be Equal divided amongst they above
mentioned Children of this my last will and Testament Revoking and
Disannulling all wills or Wills by me heretofore made. In Witness

seven hundred and ninety two

The within written Last Will and Testament of William Terrell dec^d was exhibited in Court and proved by the oaths of two of the Witnesses thereto subscribed To be the last will and Testament of the said William Terrell and was ordered to be Recorded — and on the motion of William Terrell who made oath according to Law, Administration of the Estate of the said William Terrell dec^d was granted him in due form with the will annexed Halifax County Virginia Wills 1792-1797
