In the name of God Amen.

I, Archibald Timberlake of the County of
Hanover, in the State of Virginia, considering the
uncertainty of human life, and being feeble in body
but of sound mind and disposing memory, do hereby
ordain, make and declare this to be my last will and
Testament hereby revoking all other wills by me at any time
heretofore made.

First. I desire that all my just debts and funeral expen-
ses be paid.

Second. I give, devise and bequeath unto my dear son John
Henry Timberlake my gold watch.

Third. I give devise and bequeath unto dear son John H.
Timberlake in fee simple my plantation containing one acre
situated on the lower part of the plantation with the house and
outbuildings thereon.

between five hundred and six hundred acres to be the same more or less, to him and his heirs and assigns forever. But if the said John Henry Timberlake should hereafter sell, or in any wise dispose of the said tract of land, the old Family Graveyard lying in front of my present dwelling house shall be reserved from as a family burying place of my relations with the undisturbed right of ingress and egress from the main Road over the said land, to the said Grave Yard.

Fourth. I give, devise and bequeath unto my dear Son David Algonon Timberlake in fee simple my plantation known as "Locust Green" which formerly belonged to the late Rumbin Timberlake deceased, and which I purchased from the said estate a few years since, the said farm contains two hundred and sixty acres more or less, to him and his heirs and assigns forever.

Fifth. I hereby authorize and direct my executor hereinafter to be named to sell my farm known as "Meredith" together with the piece of land which I own, extending from the line of the Meredith farm out to the Main Road, whenever he shall deem it most advantageous to the interest of my estate so to do and I hereby authorize and empower my said executor to pay all debts which I may owe at the time of my death, out of the proceeds of the sale of the said land, without resorting to a sale of my other real estate.

By my death, out of the proceeds of the Sale of the said land, without resorting to a Sale of my Slaves, and the residue after paying said debts and liabilities be equally divided between my said sons John Henry Timberlake and David Almon Timberlake.

Sixth. I own a piece of land containing about half an acre, upon which the old blacksmith Shop now stands and which adjoins the land of John C. Timberlake and others, which I desire my said executor to sell when ever he shall deem proper the proceeds of said Sale to be equally divided between my two sons herein before named.

Seventh. I own an interest in a piece of land lying and being in the County of York, in the State of Virginia the size of which, I do not know which I desire my said executor to re-assume into and sell the same whenever he shall see fit, and the proceeds of the said Sale to be equally divided between my said sons herein before named.

Eighth, all the rest and residue of my property of every description, including all Slaves, Stock, horses, furniture, farming utensils and all other property of every kind and description that I may die seized and possessed of. I hereby sever and direct shall be equally divided between my two sons David Almon Timberlake and John Henry Timberlake, Share and Share alike, and if it becomes necessary to sell the said land and other personal property that I may die seized of

for a more equal division between my said sons; I hereby
authorized and empower my said executor to sell the
said property or any part thereof in order to accomplish
this object.

Ninth: I nominate, constitute and appoint my Beloved
Brother William W Timberlake, of the City of Richmond,
sole executor of this my last will and Testament, and
hereby direct that no security shall be required of him
by the Court in which he may qualify as such. In testimo-
ny whereof I hereunto set my hand and affix my seal
this 6th day of February A.D. 1863
