I want to give her all my personal and real Estate property in Tennessee so as long as she lives and remains my widow and if she marries again I want my family settled out for the benefit of my youngest child and I want my eldest son George C. Brainerd to take property in hand if my widow marries again and see that my youngest child John W. Brainerd is taken care of from the benefits of any place, my farm and when he become 21 years of age then her four children can divide the farm and personal property between themselves equal each one take their part and is not be sold unless one of the signers part to whether is want it to remain Brainerds land as long as there is any blood relation one of the name must hold the farm and I want ^{one} $\frac{1}{4}$ of an acre reserved for a graves yard and I want it looked after

the relatives of my family I want to leave \$500 to Mary
I give my eldest daughter, and I want to give to Martha C. Butler
\$500 George C. Trueman I want George to see my affairs
and to see after my young children and I want to have the
same paid and settle up my affairs.
