With a grateful heart to Almighty God for unceasing kindness and Parental care through life, and more especially for the hope given of Eternal happiness through the love of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ, I make and declare this to be my last will & Testament, in order that I may the better be prepared to meet the last great Change ordained for mankind.

1st For the payment of my just and legal debts, I desire first the appropriation of all, or a sufficiency of all the moneys which may be due me; Secondly the proceeds of the sale of my Medical Library (but not its sacrifice) and lastly the proceeds of the sale of such perishable property as can be most readily dispensed with.

2^d My entire real estate together with my Miscellaneous Library I leave to my beloved wife Georgiana A. Curtis during her natural life or so long as she remains my widow. At her death or marriage; I give the same (my entire real estate and Miscellaneous Library) to my nephew Henry B. Curtis second son of my brother Armistead B. Curtis, to have and his heirs forever. Should my nephew (above mentioned) die being yet a minor, I desire that my beloved brother A. B. Curtis shall inherit the above named property as given to his son.

3^d of my entire household and kitchen furniture of every kind Silver, and China ware &c. together with my personal effects of all kinds I leave to my wife Georgiana A. Curtis during her natural life or so long as she remains my widow. At her death or marriage; I give the same to my nephew Henry B. Curtis second son of my brother Armistead B. Curtis, to have and his heirs forever.

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nephew (above mentioned) die being yet a minor, I desire that my
beloved brother A. B. Curtis shall inherit the above named prop-
erty as given to his son.

3^d of my entire household and kitchen furniture of every kind,
Silver, and China ware &c, together with my horses and stock of all
kinds and farming implements, I give in fee to my beloved wife G. A.
Curtis. So much as may be left after the payment of my just and
legal debts as before presented.

I do To my nephew Geo. F. Leuris I leave my silver watch which was his Father's.
5th. Owing to the smallness of my estate, I can only leave to the cherished members
of our family the appearance of my devoted love, with a sincere hope of a blessed
reunion in Heaven.

6th. My wife S. K. Leuris, I leave sole administratrix of my estate, and my
brother A. B. Leuris, trustee for his son R. B. Leuris, desiring that no security
may be required of either of them.
