I Betty Louisa Berkeley Being of Sound Mind and disposing Memory do make and ordain this my last will and Testament.

First I desire all my just debts, and funeral expences to be paid by my executor, and such specific legacies as I have bequeathed in this Will to be first distributed.

Second After the payment of my just debts and funeral expences and the distribution of the specific legacies herein bequeathed I lend to my sister Catharine R. Thurston and Betty W. Berkeley during their natural lives my land, and at their deaths to be divided and distributed in the exact proportions that I have devised in this will for my personal and mixed property.

Thirdly I desire all my personal and mixed property to be divided into three equal parts, one third of which I give and bequeath to my Brother Edmund Berkeley for life to the extent that he may use and enjoy the interest and annual income from said property and at his death I desire the said property to be equally divided between such of his daughters as remain single and unmarried at that time.

Fourthly I desire the other two thirds of said property to be again divided into three equal parts, one third of said two thirds I give and bequeath to my friend and Relation, Thomas W. Lewis. in Trust nevertheless, that he will pay over the interest or annual income from the same to my brother William W. Berkeley during the life of said Thomas W. Lewis, and

After his death I desire the said property to be equally divided between
such of his daughters as remain single and unmarried at that time
One third of said two thirds. I give and bequeath to my friend (and
relative) The Revd. James A. Latane in Trust that he will pay over (and
apply the interest and annual income from the said to the personal comf-
ort of my dear and afflicted Brother Carter Berkeley D.M. during the life
of the same Carter Berkeley and at his death I desire said property to be
equally divided between such of his daughters as remain single and
unmarried at that time. The remaining third of said two thirds I give
and bequeath to my sister Sally N. Berkeley for her life and at her
death I desire the said property to be equally divided between my
two sons and my new phis namely Thomas N. Berkeley eldest
son of my Brother Edmund Berkeley Gregory I. Bidwell Berkeley eldest
son of my Brother Carter Berkeley and William Witherspoon Berkeley
second son of my Brother William N. Berkeley

Fifth I desire my executor to pay into the hands of my friend (and
faithful Pastor) The Revd. Joshua Peterkin the sum of \$100, one hundred
dollars, one half of which I give and bequeath to his daughter Rebecca
Peterkin, the other half to be given by the Revd. Peterkin to any
benevolent Institution that he may think best to bestow it on.
Six. I desire my executor to pay into the hands of the Samuel I
Hudson The sum of \$30. thirty dollars to be by him laid out in three
Copys of the best English edition of the Bible that can be procured for
that sum and given in my name to my three poor children

Esther Harrison, Sonner Harrison and Percy Harrison.
Said, I desire that my estate give over into the hands of my three
nephews, Mary Emma Holand, Lucy Robinson Lewis, and Mary Susan Berkeley
by the articles mentioned in a memorandum that I have made as part
and parcel of this will, and that the said Mary E. Holand, Lucy R. Lewis and
Mary S. Berkeley, deliver each article to the individual to whom it is written.
I do hereby constitute and appoint my nephew Henry Robinson Berkeley
my executor and do require of him to give any security, but am power
him to sell any part of my property if necessary to carry out the provisions
of this will. And I do hereby revoke and make void all other wills by me
heretofore made and declare this to be my last will and Testament.
