do make and ordain this my last will and Testament.

First - I desire all my just debts and funeral expences to be paid
by my Executor, and such specific legacies as I shall bequeath in this
will to be first distributed.

Second - After the payment of my just debts and funeral expenses
and the distribution of the specific legacies herein bequeathed I leave to
my daughters Catharine H. Thornton and Sally H. Berkeley during their natural
lives my land, and at their deaths to be divided and distributed in the
exact proportion that I shall direct in this will for my personal and
mixed property.

Thirdly - I desire all my personal and mixed property to be divided into
three equal parts, one third of which I give and bequeath to my Brother
Edmund Berkeley for life to the intent that he may use and enjoy the
interest and annual income from said property. And at his death I desire
the said property to be equally divided between such of his daughters as
remain single and unmarried at that time.

Fourthly - I desire the other two thirds of said property to be again divided
into three equal parts, one third of said two thirds I give and bequeath
to my friend and Relation Thomas H. Lewis in Trust nevertheless, that
he will pay over the interest or annual income from the same to my brother

After my death I desire the said property to be equally divided between
such of his daughters as remain single and unmarried at that time
One third of said two thirds, I give and bequeath to my friend (and)
Relative The Revd. James A. Latane in trust that he will pay over and
apply the interest and annual income from the said to the personal es-
tate of my dear and afflicted Brother Carter Berkley D. M. during the life
of the same Carter Berkley and at his death I desire said property to be
equally divided between such of his daughters as remain single and
unmarried at that time. The remaining third of said two thirds, I give
and bequeath to my sister Sally H. Berkley for her life and at her
death I desire the said property to be equally divided between my
Mrs. Hodges and my now deceased brother Thomas H. Berkley oldest
son of my brother Edmund Berkley leaving T. Bush Berkley and
son of my brother Carter Berkley and William H. H. Berkley
Second son of my brother William H. H. Berkley

Fifth I desire my executors to pay into the hands of my kind (and)
affectionate Pastor The Revd. Joshua Estokin the sum of \$100, one hundred
dollars, one half of which I give and bequeath to his daughter Rubina
Estokin, the other half to be given by the Revd. Joshua Estokin to my
Benevolent Institution that by may kind hand to sustain it on
dis. I desire my executors to pay into the hands of Mr. Samuel J.
Garrison the sum of five Thirty dollars to be kept in his safe in three

and parcel of this will and that he shall have full authority to do so.
Many of Berkeley, deliver each article to the individual believed to be entitled.
I do hereby constitute and appoint my nephews Henry Robinson Berkley
my executors and don't require of him to give any security, but am power
him to sell any part of my property if necessary to carry out the provisions
of this will, and I do hereby revoke and make void all other testaments
heretofore made and declare this to be my last will and testament.
